It is that time of year when Christmas and New Year celebrations seem to be a distant memory. The decorations have probably been taken down in our homes. In church we have celebrated Jesus' birth and the visit of the wise men with their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. However, that is not the end of the story of Jesus as a young child. Mary, Joseph and Jesus travelled to the Temple in Jerusalem.

The holy family were being obedient to Jewish law. A first-born son must be circumcised after eight days, then later presented in the Temple and be redeemed by an offering to God. At the Temple the family were met and welcomed by Simeon and Anna. These were two wise and faithful people in their latter years – and they've been waiting.

Simeon was an elderly priest in The Temple. Anna had come to live in the Temple complex after being widowed. They had spent many years waiting for the child, God's Son, the Saviour of the world.

Simeon's joy was such, that, as he took the young child into his arms, he praised God; he had seen Jesus the light of the world. But also had a message for Mary, the new mother, that challenging times would lie ahead.

Anna and Simeon had waited patiently for years. Waiting is something which can be incredibly difficult, waiting for good or bad news. Waiting patiently can open new possibilities. Anna and Simeon waited for the birth of Jesus who would bring light into the world and were then able to welcome him.

In churches it is traditional to leave cribs in place until the feast of Candlemas on 2nd February. Candlemas is also the time of year when it is traditional to bless the candles to be used during the coming year. In our church services on Sunday 1st February there will be an opportunity to hear the story of Jesus' presentation in the temple and Simeon and Anna welcoming him. Some services that day will also involve lighting candles as we symbolise the move away from Christmas and towards Lent as well as the tradition of blessing the candles to be used in the year ahead.

PLEASE where possible try to recycle your glass in the glass recycling bins at the Wenn Evans Centre – the Parish Council receives the money for this, which will mean that the parish portion of the council tax will be lower for all parishioners who pay council tax.

Dogs under control!

It is very important that dogs are kept under proper control in the village to ensure the safety and comfort of everyone who uses our shared spaces. Under the Dangerous Dogs Act 1991 and the Dogs Act 1871, owners can face serious consequences if their dog behaves aggressively or is allowed to be “dangerously out of control,” even if no injury occurs. Local Public Spaces Protection Orders (PSPOs) can also require dogs to be kept on leads in certain areas, with fines for those who ignore the rules. By keeping dogs close, supervised, and under control, owners help protect wildlife, children, pedestrians, and other pets—maintaining a safe and welcoming community for all.

St Marys Church Digital Heritage Project

North Norfolk District Council, through Coastwise, is working with the community in Happisburgh to commission Wessex Archaeology to undertake a project at St Mary's the Virgin to digitally preserve the building and its surroundings as part of an exciting new project.

The digital heritage project will promote St Mary's as a 'living church', so it can be remembered as a well-used hub of the community in Happisburgh. The project will create digital models to capture the church as a building, its surroundings, features, stories, memories of the congregation, the surrounding community and the landscape. These will be available for all to view online on touchscreens or VR headsets.

The church and graveyard are at risk of coastal erosion in the long term, and the community working with the project expressed the desire to produce a digital 3D model of the church. The project will be an opportunity to create a community archive of Happisburgh life, past and present and can include visions for the future.

Wessex Archaeology is very experienced in delivering heritage preservation projects and is very keen to support the Happisburgh Community in developing this project for their future. You can find out more about Wessex Archaeology at their website, www.wessexarch.co.uk.

They will be hosting a launch event on Sunday 15th February, from 9.30am - 11am and from 12pm - 4pm, to meet the community and gather community stories and photos. Fieldwork will follow, during which they will capture the church and the graveyard using drones and 360 cameras to create 3D models of the church and its surroundings using photogrammetry and videogrammetry techniques.

Everyone in the community and wider area is invited to attend and learn about how the digital product will be created and to get involved.

There will be opportunities to learn how to use the equipment and to speak to the team who will be creating the product.

We'd love it if you could all bring along any photos, videos, pictures, or memories of Happisburgh that you would like to share, which will become part of the project. We are particularly interested in any recordings of the carol singing or Christmas services.

Wild Touch (Mill Common Road, Ridlington)

are running a Facebook 'Go Fund Me' on their page for winter fuel and heating costs. Also any wild birdseed donations are appreciated in their white bin on the driveway entrance, Mill Common road (Poachers Pocket end) as well as ongoing towels, fleeces etc – thank you.

Leaves provide shelter for insects and other invertebrates which are an important food source for birds and other wildlife. Collect them up and add them to your wild corner of the garden or compost heap or under hedges for the hedgehogs who will take them to their shelters for hibernation. Don't cut back all your perennial plants, their stems offer overwintering sites for insects and the seed heads provides food for birds.
