## Revd Coryn writes...

At the time of writing, I have been in post for just over three months. I am still meeting people who tell me what a wonderful institution service it was in early December in Hickling Church. One of my friends described it like this:

'What a wonderful service and welcome for you! Starlight and church bells ringing out across the night. Torchlight as we made our way across a dark field. The church, so large, with lighted windows, almost like a Christmas card! Then all the warmth and deep joy inside!'

A belated thank you for such a wonderful, welcoming service.

I imagine that by the time you read this your Easter celebrations will be in full swing. After the solemnity of Lent, we will have gathered for worship, both on the beach at Sea Palling at sunrise and later on Easter Day in churches across the benefice to exclaim: 'Alleluia. Christ is risen. He is risen indeed. Alleluia.' Jesus' resurrection is the joyful climax of the Christian story and is indeed a time to celebrate.

There will be further celebration in the coming weeks. Not least because in June we have two services of Choral Evensong to look forward to. On Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> June at 4pm, Kings' Voices from Kings College, Cambridge are coming to sing at Hempstead Church. Then on Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> June at 3.30pm, the choir from Norwich Cathedral are coming to sing Choral Evensong in Happisburgh Church. It is an enormous privilege for us to host worship sung by such amazing choirs. I do hope you will be able to join us on one or both of these dates and invite your friends too.

Recently, I have had the privilege of being in some of the schools in the benefice. I have met children and staff in Happisburgh, Hickling and Bacton schools. The very exciting news is that Hickling and Happisburgh schools are very keen to engage with Open the Book. If you don't know about Open the Book, it is an exciting storytelling project run by the Bible Society where Bible stories are shared with children in schools in a way which is fun, interactive and memorable.

I am looking to form a storytelling team which would visit Hickling and Happisburgh schools on alternate weeks to present a 10–15 minute scripted Bible story to a school assembly and involving the children in this.

I used to belong to a story telling team which went into schools in Tasburgh and Saxlingham and it was the highlight of my week. You don't need to be a great actor and there are no words to learn. You do need to be enthusiastic and keen to present Bible stories. The group will need at least one person who can narrate the story by reading loudly and clearly. Other members of the group take on the parts of the characters in the story. The children love engaging with the stories and their knowledge of the Bible really grows.

I already have one or two volunteers but would ideally like to form a team of six to eight people who could go into school on a Monday or Wednesday. There will be a meeting for all those interested in May but in the meantime come and have a chat if you think you might be interested or leave me a message.

Please come and say hello if you see me around your village.

#### What to do if you find a Baby Birdie

Your nearest rescue centre is 'Wild Touch' on Mill Common Rd.; please telephone first for advice and to ensure assistance is available: 07765345441.

What to do when you see a bird out of its nest? providing a CAT has not had any interaction and also appears undamaged, just pick it up and pop it back in!

In any other situation - contain it, keep it warm but NOT on a hot water bottle as it will overheat (if they are gasping they are NOT thirsty just too hot). Initially: keep it safe and telephone for advice. Most importantly, please please please DO NOT give baby birds any food (unless otherwise told to by rescue centre) and ESPECIALLY NO WATER. Ring for rescue advice ASAP.

If you can walk up and touch a wild animal it usually does need your help, but remember that Fledgling birds (fully feathered, except tail may not have grown out) have been jumping out of their nests for thousands of years and will usually survive if healthy and parent birds are still around to feed it.

If you have any concerns over any wild animals just ring Wild Touch. Thank you for caring. Sheila xx

#### SEPSIS AWARENESS

The Community First Responders want to raise awareness of sepsis during 2024. It is a potentially life-threatening condition that arises when the body's response to infection causes injury to its own tissues and organs. Those at risk include people who have had recent surgery or physical injury, a weakened immune system including diabetes, cancer, burns and pneumonia. Add to this the common signs, we refer to as red flags, which include high temperature, faster breathing rate, a faster heart rate, painful urination and possible confusion to name some red flags. If you see a rapid onset of any of the red flags and fall into the higher risk group – think sepsis. Seek advice from 111 or if the situation requires phone 999.
