Just before Trinity Sunday, at the end of May, we celebrated Pentecost; a dynamic event symbolised by bright flames of fire, announcing the birth of the Church.

Did you know that the Church organises itself around two very different calendars?

One begins in January and is determined by the sun and moon and is organised into days, months and years.

The other begins at Advent and is determined by particular events in the life of Jesus.

This calendar begins with Advent - anticipating Christmas – when the Son of God comes to us in Jesus Christ. Then, Easter celebrates Jesus's resurrection victory over death.

Finally, Pentecost celebrates the birthday of the Church, recalling how the Holy Spirit turning frightened disciples into bold witnesses of the Resurrection. Pentecost reminds us that God is an active, empowering presence, sparking new life in our communities just as the spring growth erupts across our fields and hedgerows.

Christmas, Easter and Pentecost are significant because they are God-with-us events. In each of these God events, the one God always acts in a three-person way: the Father who sends; the Son who responds to the Father; the Holy Spirit who empowers the Son to reveal the Father's love.

Now, as we enter June, the Church calendar's focus shifts from the dramatic rushing wind of Pentecost to the profound, quiet mystery of God, whose identity was celebrated on Trinity Sunday.

Whilst God is indeed a mystery, the doctrine of the Trinity is how the Church describes this Christmas-Easter-Pentecost God. In our too-often fragmented world, the Trinity offers a model of community: not a distant, isolated deity, but a relational God who invites us to be a community of self-giving love.

Living in rural communities, we understand the importance of relationship – of neighbour looking out for neighbour, as well as within our church congregations and in the wider North Norfolk community. We in this community are called to share in a love that doesn't hold back, but spills over to the lonely, the lost and the marginalised.

Trinity Sunday reminds us that our parish life, friendships, services and outreach are intended to be a reflection of God's own life. The Creator (Father), Redeemer (Son), and Sustainer (Spirit) are present with us, guiding our stewardship of this beautiful landscape and our efforts to be a welcoming and caring Church.

May we be encouraged in knowing that the God who created the sea and sky, who walked the dusty roads of Galilee and who now dwells with us as Spirit is a relational God. As a community of Coastal Group churches may we thrive in bringing the vibrant life of the Trinity into every aspect of our daily lives.

Have you been thinking about your Christian faith? Do you want to explore issues to do with faith? We are hoping to set up a small group where people can do this in preparation for baptism, confirmation or the reaffirmation of confirmation promises.

Confirmation is a special church service in which a person confirms the promises that were made when they were baptized. If you were baptized at a christening when you were a child, your parents and godparents made these promises on your behalf. As an adult, you may want to affirm these promises for yourself and commit your life to following Jesus Christ. At a confirmation service, you make these promises for yourself. Your friends and family as well as the local Christian community will be there to promise to support and pray for you. The local bishop will lay their hands on your head and ask God's Holy Spirit to give you the strength and commitment to live God's way for the rest of your life.

If you have come into the Church of England from another Christian denomination, confirmation is a way of becoming a formal member of the Church of England as well as reaffirming promises made at the time of baptism.

What to do if you find a Baby Birdie - if a bird is out of its nest, providing a CAT has not had any interaction, and also appears undamaged, just pick it up and pop it back in!

In any other situation, contain it, keep it warm but NOT on a hot water bottle as it will overheat (if they are gasping they are NOT thirsty just too hot). Initially: keep it safe and telephone for advice. Most importantly, please DO NOT give baby birds any food (unless otherwise told to by rescue centre) and ESPECIALLY NO WATER. Ring for rescue advice ASAP. If you can walk up and touch a wild animal it usually does need your help, but remember that Fledgling birds (fully feathered, except tail may not have grown out) have been jumping out of their nests for thousands of years and will usually survive if healthy and parent birds are still around to feed it.

If you have any concerns over any wild animals just ring Wild Touch. Thank you for caring. If interested please ring 07798 916636 or email wild.touch@outlook.com.
