September 2025



September is my favourite month. It signals a change in season, what the poet e.e. cummings describes as "septembering." The fullness of summer with its long days and sunlit evenings begins its migration to winter leanness. Days get shorter, signalling leaves to fall, and nuts – chestnut, acorn, beech, wild hazelnut, and horse chestnut - plumpen and fall to the ground. It is a time of change, of new beginnings; of out with the old, and in with the new.

There is a gentleness around September as the land begins to transit softly towards hibernation. For me September, and the changes it announces, is a liminal space in the year full of quiet change, and hope of new beginnings. It is a time to regroup - a moment to breathe in a colder and longer breath - and to be reminded anew that the law of energy output requires a change in pace, and from summer and its activities to one that lets batteries recharge. It is a time of grace, when spring and summer activities give way to the slower pace Autumn and Winter provide.

Of course, we, too, are caught up in our own domestic forms of change, of migration, as well as new beginnings. Summer's clothing undergoes its own hibernation in out-of-sight drawers and closets to make space for winter garb; little and older ones progress to new forms of education.

Set against our varied experiences of septembering and the change in season repeated since the dawn of time, as well as the challenges of new beginnings, it is good to ponder a reality not prone to the vagaries of our changing seasons. God declares about himself, "I am the Lord, I change not" (Malachi 3 verse 6). Jesus Christ, we are reminded, "is the same yesterday, today, and forever" (Hebrews 13 verse 8). It is also reassuring to know that this same God has similarly experienced, through Jesus Christ, the same challenges we face in our various domestic changes, whether they be new beginnings, migrations, or hibernations.




